

# University Staff Advisory Council Meeting Brief and Updates for Staff

October 2024

## **October 2024 General Council Meeting Recap**

Jennifer Wilkes, vice president for human resources, Christy Helms, senior director of talent management, and Jennifer Pritts, senior director of compensation, presented upcoming changes to the HR Talent Strategy and the Workforce Planning process. Topics discussed included the promotion process and employee recognition program. Updates include:

- Workforce Planning tools will roll out in 2025.
- A staff engagement survey will be sent in the coming months. USAC will be involved in the planning/roll out efforts.
- The HR Training and Professional Development Policy, <u>HR38</u>, will be reviewed in 2025 to clarify professional development opportunities for staff.
- A portal with resources and information will be available for those who want to be mentors.
- The Years of Service Recognition Program yearbook was designed to recognize
  employees. The yearbook functions much like a digital card; colleagues can dedicate a
  few minutes to share kudos, memories, and positive words of encouragement to their

- Following a request from USAC, HR shared that 60 percent of staff university-wide received a salary increase because of the Compensation Modernization initiative. The remaining 40% of staff that did not receive an increase were appropriately situated within their new staff salary grades and therefore did not necessitate a transition adjustment;

## **Updates from USAC**

One of USAC's strategic goals is to increase staff representation and work toward shared governance. In a step toward accomplishing that goal, the USAC Chair-Elect will join the USAC Chair and Immediate Past-Chair as staff representatives to the Board of Trustees. The chair and chair-elect serve on the Equity and Human Resources Committee and the past-chair serves on the Student Success Committee.
