February General Council Meeting Highlights

• Streamlining Hiring & Recruitment

 Lori Gondak, senior director of talent acquisition for Human Resources, along with Operational Excellence Team members Emily Foley, Sherrie Borden, Angela Church, Ally Christopher, and Lindsey Torba, provided updates on streamlining Workday functionality and the hiring process. Details were shared on improvements being made, such as approval processes. Next steps include training for financial officers, budget administrators, managers, and recruiting support. • Policy Updates

- USAC received notice of Human Resources policy updates:
 - (HR78) Addressing Unacceptable Conduct and Performance for Full-Time Staff Employees was recently revised to more clearly outline the progressive process for managers to address concerns regarding a staff member's inappropriate conduct in the workplace.

Updates from USAC

- Thank you to the 400 staff who attended USAC's recent <u>listening sessions</u>, hosted annually as part of our commitment to ensure all staff voices are heard and valued. While half of the registered attendees were from University Park, every campus from across the commonwealth had representation during the session, including Extension, College of Medicine, and World Campus. Follow-up surveys were sent to all who registered to gather additional feedback, and the anonymous data gathered will be summarized and presented to University leadership then used to inform USAC's future planning and initiatives.
